# CIRCLE TIME



During Circle Time, Pre-KG children actively listened and followed actions with enthusiasm. They shared about their favourite toys and discussed how they take care of themselves.

The little ones joyfully followed game instructions, talked about what they'd like to be in a garden, and shared thoughtful ideas on keeping their classroom clean.

LKG children learned the importance of good manners and polite expressions. They greeted others with a smile and practiced using words like hello, please, sorry, thank you, and welcome. Children shared how to ask for things, respond politely, do tasks independently and discussed ways to keep their classroom clean and tidy.

UKG children engaged in meaningful discussions about teamwork and responsibility. They shared ways to work in groups, take care of friends, and follow rules during outdoor visits. The children also talked about caring for their classroom, sharing things equally, and learned safe practices on a visit to a garden.

# THEME TIME

During Theme Time, Pre-KG children explored the world around them through fun, hands-on activities. They pointed to pictures of toys in a story, played “I Spy” to find toys, and named things seen in a garden. The little ones enjoyed touching and sorting objects, guessing insect names, and pretending to be tiny insects buzzing around.

LKG children learned interesting facts about plants and their importance. They observed different flowers, identified pictures of plants, and discussed how plants differ from one another. The children also named various food items, discovered where fruits and vegetables come from, and joyfully prepared a healthy and delicious sandwich.

UKG children explored the fascinating world of pet animals, wild animals and garden creatures. They identified and distinguished between pet and wild animals, how to take care of pet animals. They discussed the special body parts of garden animals, named their homes, and shared ways to stay safe around them. Through storytelling and pretend play, they answered questions and did a role play on garden creatures.

# ENGLISH TIME



Pre-KG children enjoyed singing action songs and exploring letters through engaging activities. They pointed and traced pictures beginning with the letter K, answered questions from picture cards, and practiced tracing the letter M. The little ones also drew curves on sand and confidently wrote the letter N with enthusiasm.

LKG children had fun exploring language through interactive English time activities. They used question cards to ask about the story, played Bingo and a letter sound game, and participated in a quiz. The children described different feelings, named pictures beginning with N and W, and practiced tracing the letters V and W with confidence.

UKG children enhanced their language skills through engaging English Time activities. They retold the story "Grasshopper's Winter" and joyfully pretended to act like garden animals. The children listened to a story with the bl-sound and practiced making words beginning with the sounds br- and gr-, building confidence in phonics and storytelling.




# MATH TIME

Pre-KG children explored numbers and positions through fun Math Time activities. They counted objects for the number 4 using play dough and enjoyed listening to the story "Ron is Waiting." The little ones traced the number 5, counted objects to tell how many, arranged objects to show position words (in front, behind and between), and happily read a poem about kittens.

LKG children strengthened their math skills through engaging hands-on activities. They built towers with six blocks, drew six trees, and practiced writing the number 6. The children compared long and short objects, identified and showed the number 7, and confidently counted and wrote the number 7 with understanding and accuracy.

UKG children explored number concepts through exciting Math Time activities. They learned about more than and less than, solved simple problems, and practiced reading and writing number names till 50. The children built block towers while counting to 30, arranged number cards in order, and counted forward and backward with confidence.

# PLAY TIME



Pre-KG children had an active and joyful play time filled with fun motor-skill activities. They pedaled around buckets, threw balls at targets, and carefully put pegs into holes. The little ones balanced as they walked on a curved line and enjoyed playing the tiptoe game, building coordination and body control through play.

LKG children enjoyed exciting activities that strengthened their gross and fine motor skills. They rolled on the ground, practiced cutting paper along straight lines, and hopped forward and backward with enthusiasm. The children also ran and made turns confidently, showing great energy, balance, and coordination during play.


UKG children had an energetic and fun-filled Play Time. They practiced throwing and catching a ball, improving their hand-eye coordination and control. Through these playful activities, the children developed focus, teamwork, and confidence while enjoying every moment of active learning.

# ART TIME

Pre-KG children expressed their creativity during Art Time through fun, hands-on activities. They made new shapes by folding paper, decorated the shapes using colorful blocks, and joyfully squeezed clay with hands. These activities helped enhance their fine motor skills, imagination, and love for creative exploration.

LKG children enjoyed engaging Art and Life Skill activities that promoted independence and coordination. They practiced catching a large ball and learned to use a zipper on their own. The children also folded a napkin into a neat triangle, showcasing growing confidence in everyday skills.

UKG children showcased their creativity and focus during Art Time. They created beautiful artworks using colourful circles and practiced colouring neatly within the lines. These activities encouraged careful hand control, creativity and attention to detail, allowing the children to express themselves artistically with confidence and joy.

## LITERARY EVENTS

1) KG3 Show & Tell (2<sup>nd</sup> October)– KG3 students spoke on the topic ‘I Am A Community Helper’ during the Show and Tell activity held on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2025. The students explained the role and importance of community helpers in a society. The Show & Tell activity was a reinforcement exercise to gauge the learners understanding of community helpers which was a part of the curriculum.

2) Literary activities conducted in KG1 and KG2 (9<sup>th</sup> October 2025) – KG2 students did a Show & Tell activity on the topics My Favourite Family Member/My Favourite Cartoon Character /My Best Friend on 9<sup>th</sup> October 2025. KG1 students recited famous rhymes as part of the Recitation activity done on 9<sup>th</sup> October 2025. The Literary activities are done to augment the communication and presentation skills of the young learners.



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The KG field trip to Dolphin village on 13<sup>th</sup> October was much enjoyed by the KG students. Dolphin Village hosted an array of activities like Dolphin show, magic show, juggling objects in air etc which created fond memories for the little ones of kindergarten.
